Lenten Sundays

The Armenian Church takes us through each Sunday of Lent with a story which helps us to know God's will for us. Today is the *fifth Sunday of Lent* and is called the *Sunday of the Judge*. In today's parable Jesus reminds us of the great importance of prayer, keeping the lines of communication open between God and us.. We must always pray whether it be through private prayer and in any place or through communal worship but we should never lose heart.. He (Jesus) uses as an example of an "unjust" judge who neglects the pleas of a poor widow until, tired of her persistence, he hands down a decision and sends her ways. Reflect on Luke 18:1-8

Altar Curtains Closed

During Lent, the church changes its outward appearance. As we enter church the most noticeable change we see is that the sanctuary is closed with black curtains. A special Lenten altar is set up on front of the curtain. It has several steps in height and has a picture of the crucifixion. It has candles on the steps. The altar curtain being closed is symbolic of the expulsion of Adam and Eve from paradise – the Kingdom of Heaven. Sin separates us from God just like the curtain separates us from the altar. Sin is what prevents us from truly enjoying God and being in His presence.
