Proper manner to offer condolences in the case of a priest.

You may enter the sanctuary (in silence) and approach the family to offer condolences. Following which you may approach the casket. As is the tradition in the Armenian Church for all clergymen, it is proper to kiss the clergyman's hand which was consecrated with Holy Muron at the time of his ordination. In the case of a deceased priest, upon arriving at the casket, it is proper to do one or all of the following.

Kiss the deceased priest's right hand, then kiss the Holy Gospel. You may cross yourself as you offer a prayer to God for his soul. You may simply bow in reverence. You may simply stand in silence.

(We ask that women remove their lipstick prior to kissing the priest's hand. Tissue's are available.)

As this santuary is a place of prayer and is not a Funeral Home or Social Hall, we ask that anyone wishing to socialize go downstairs to the cultural hall where refreshments are available. All are invited to remain in silent prayer in the sanctuary as long as they wish.
