2. **Gavar School, Armenia.** This is the only school in all Armenia completely devoted to the education of children aged 6-18 with mental and physical disabilities. Gavar School was established in 1976 and has a current enrollment of 90 children with challenges ranging from autism to Down's Syndrome.

Lenten Sundays

In the Armenian Church all Sundays of Lent have meaningful names, which reminds us to know God's will for us. Today is the *fifth Sunday of Lent* and is called the **Sunday of the Judge.** In today's parable Jesus reminds us of the great importance of prayer, keeping the lines of communication open between God and us. We must always pray whether it be through private prayers and in any place or through communal worship but we should never lose heart. He (Jesus) used as an example of an exasperated, self-centered judge who neglects the pleas of a poor widow, the victim of inequity, who asks him to do her justice. The judge finally renders a decision only to be rid of her and sends her away. Reflect on Luke 18: 1-8.
